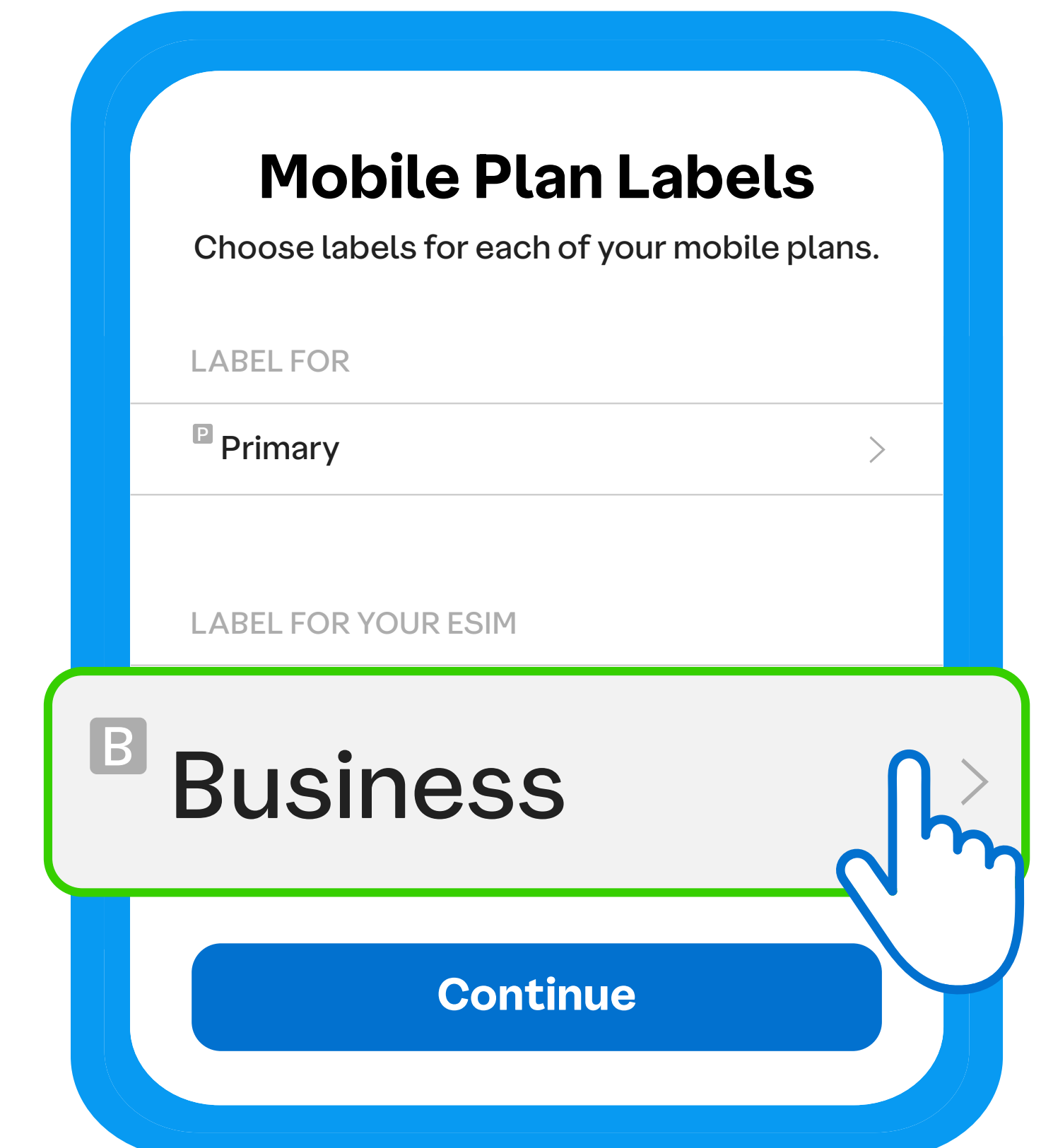
- Tap **"Enter Detail Manually"**

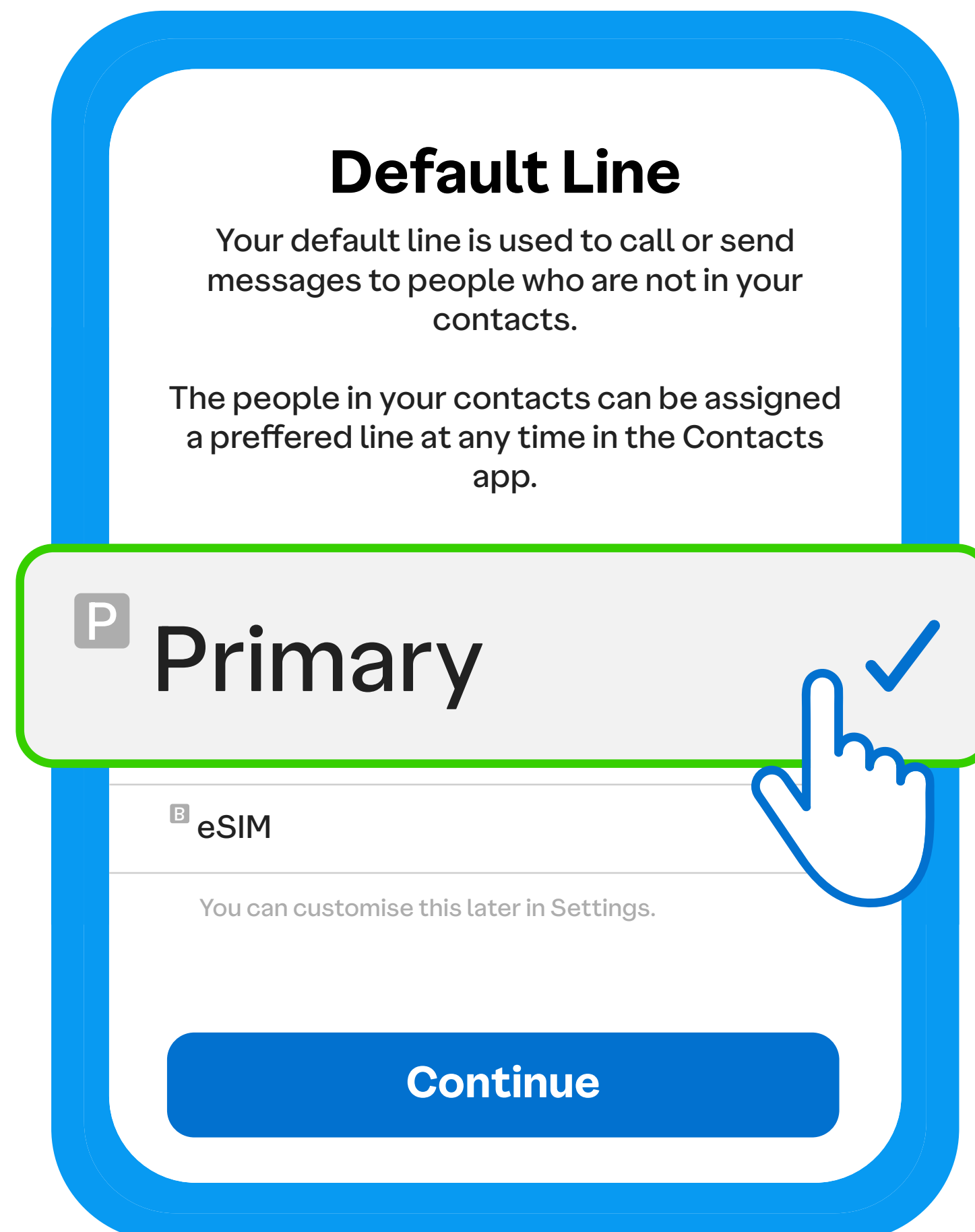

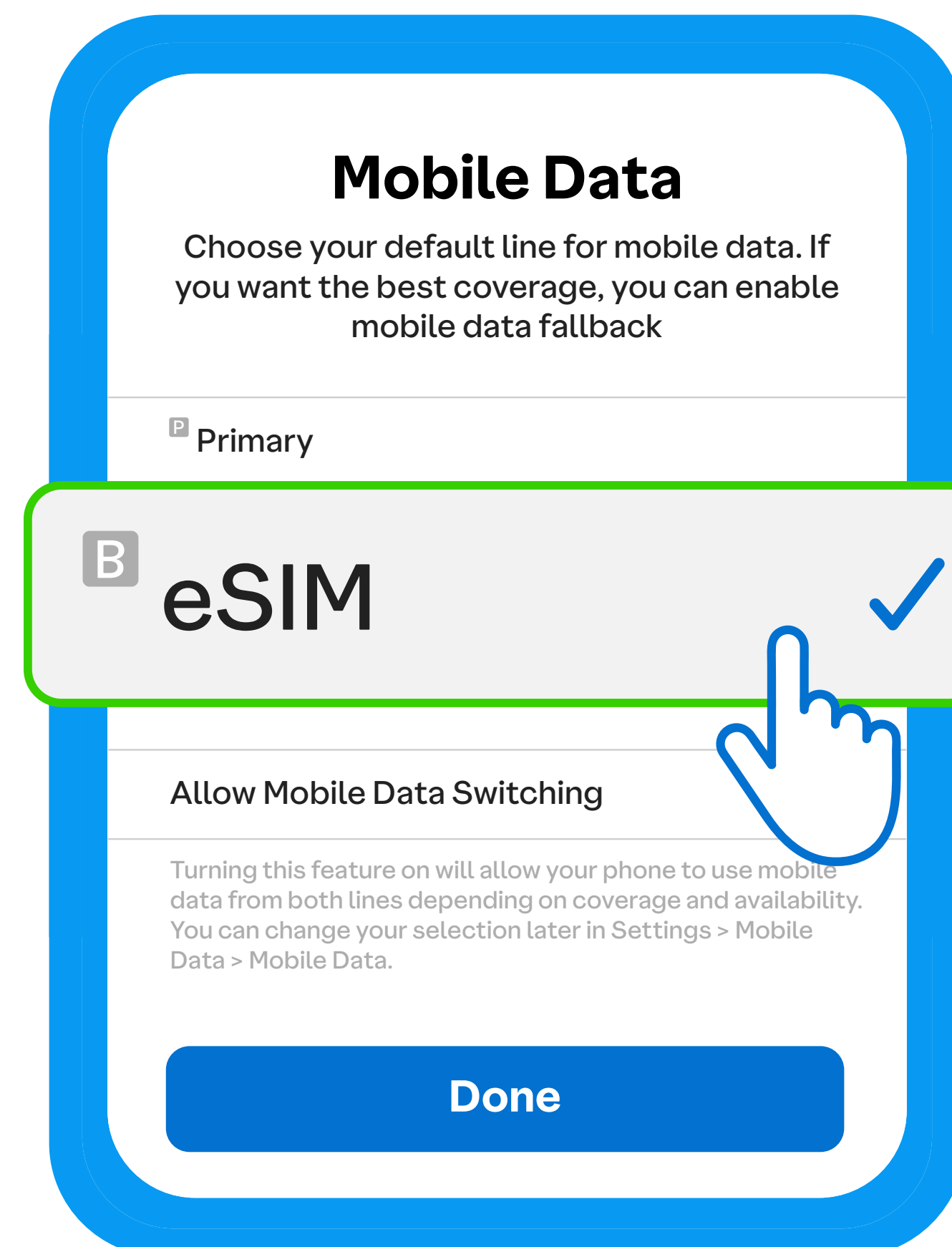
